As an administrator and fiduciary of many types of charitable funds, gift arrangements and charitable transfers of property, The Florida United Methodist Foundation, Inc. receives certain personal, non-public information directly from donors or with the authorized consent of a donor that is contained on applications, statements, forms or documents that are received by the Foundation or reviewed by the Foundation in connection with any gift or charitable arrangement. All such non-public personal information is held in confidence by the Foundation and is not released or disclosed to any unaffiliated third party or person, except for the Foundation staff members that are granted access to this information in the course of conducting the Foundations' normal duties and functions, unless otherwise authorized by the donor, or as required or permitted under applicable law.

In order to thank and recognize donors and encourage others to make charitable gifts, the names of donors are published with the donor's consent from time to time in the Foundation's newsletter and annual report. No such publication occurs, however, if the donor requests anonymity. In order to guard and protect each donor's non-public personal information from unauthorized disclosure, The Florida United Methodist Foundation, Inc. maintains physical, electronic and procedural safeguards that comply with federal regulations.
